

From the Rector...

Dear Members of All Saints' Parish Family,

Jesus said, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourself and rest a while" Mark 6.31



We, who are blessed to live in Muskoka, don't have to go far to find a "deserted place", whether beside the still waters of our many lakes and rivers, on the quiet trails of our forests, or in a canoe as the mists rise. It is in moments and places such as these where our souls are restored. Each day, in the midst of the sometimes hectic rhythm of summer, we have cause and opportunity to respond to the Word of the Lord, penned by the psalmist,

*'Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations,
I am exalted in the earth.'* [Psalm 46.10]

Even if we are unable to physically "get away", we can pause, exhale, and spend a few moments alone with the Lord, being refreshed...like the mother of John Wesley who famously, in the midst of her brood of 19 children, would lift her apron over her head, as a signal to her family that she was spending a few minutes "communing with the Lord", being renewed and restored for her tasks at hand.

We give thanks to God for Beverly Van Der Jagt and her assistance, for Joy Stott who co-ordinated the week, for Michele Collins who set the atmosphere with her "sets", for those who were story-tellers and helpers, for those who supported the week's activities, and for all who have prayed, and continue to pray, for those involved in this youth outreach adventure!

Reaching out into our community is part of what we are called to do as God's people. As Christians we all share the same *Mission: to go into all the world and preach the Good News to every creature [Mark 15.16]*. 'All the world' can be our neighbourhoods, the docks or beaches of our lakes, or wherever we may be this summer...anywhere we share the Love of Christ Jesus our Lord.

Sharing Good News is being outward looking. As people become anxious about all the changes ahead - within our Deanery, our Diocese and the wider Anglican Church - it is tempting to look inward and concentrate on our own sphere. However, it is good to remember the words of Brother Andrew: *'The work of the church is not survival. She exists to fulfil the Great Commission.'*

The autumn will be here all-too-soon, with its many plans and activities, for which we all prepare. Meanwhile, in the warmth of summer, by whichever 'still waters' we find refreshment, let us always rejoice, with thanksgiving in the presence and the goodness of our God, who renews us and empowers us to be His church in the world.

The youth attend the *Ugly Couch Club* right after school each Friday at THE DOOR on Princess Street, around the corner from All Saints'. The youth walk over to our hall for 5:30 p.m. and help by the setting tables and cleaning up. Occasionally, they even cook. Many don't know that the youth from The Door set up the tables and chairs for our Church's coffee hour and the Men's Breakfast as a thank you to us for the meal. Around 7 p.m. the youth return back to The Door for their "open door" drop-in till 10 p.m. Leaders from Youth for Christ, James Hunt and Tara, join us for dinner.

Prayer and grace begins our meals and everyone is encouraged to take a turn. Some heartfelt prayers are warmly shared. Table talk includes sharing, support, and the happy/good moments of the week or day! Sometimes I will have a challenge or game for the youth.

Thank you to Joe Pace for his donations of meals, and long hours of cooking from scratch (his homemade pasta, yum!) and other delights! Joe doesn't wait for us to ask for seconds, he's there in a flash passing around whatever is left in the pans! Chef Joe, thank you!

I want to especially give a warm **Thank You** to a special young lady who chose to help us in the kitchen. Ravyn has worked hard and learned a lot about food prep and cooking. We so appreciate her choice to volunteer with us. She has been willing to contribute to this Outreach Program, long past her earning the 40 hours of community work for school! You are certainly letting "your light shine" so others can see your good works, and praise our Father in heaven for you, your kindness, doing good in service to others! Bless you, Ravyn!




In the afternoon we went to the Huntsville Bowling Alley and we had a LOT OF SPARES and STRIKES! Snacks, laughs, and FUN!



JESUS SAID, "Go!"

'Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation.' [Mark 16:15]

There are many things which can help us be like Jesus so that we can tell others about Him. Of course, the most important thing is to pray each day. Jesus made time during His super busy days to talk to His Heavenly Father—and that's praying, just talking to God and

listening to His answer. And God's Holy Spirit will help us with our prayers.

Being thankful and giving thanks each day is very important. Jesus always gave thanks for His food; He always gave thanks for God's presence with Him. We remember to give thanks for those who look after us and those who teach us. It's also important to pray for our country and its leaders. And it's good to pray for children around the world especially those who face danger and disaster almost everyday.




